The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (signed into law February 17, 2009) appropriates an unprecedented level of federal funding (over \$6 hundred million for New Hampshire) aimed at preserving and creating jobs, investing in transportation, environmental protection and other infrastructure, spurring technological advances, and stabilizing state and local government budgets. The statute requires that spending and activity commence as quickly as possible in an effort to jump-start economic recovery.

NH DOT SITE

- Funds Anticipated for NH
- Highway and Bridge - \$129.4 million
- Transit – estimated \$13 million
- Rail – unknown, competitive for high speed intercity rail funds
- Aeronautics – \$4 to \$5 million
- Typical Highway and Bridge Program -\$140 million/yr.
